#### 第三部份、閱讀理解

(A) The Ministry of Education (MOE) in Taiwan has responded to the increasing demand for competent English users in the current society by extending English education to the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade of elementary school since the 2005 academic year. Not only the government, but also parents and teachers are having growing awareness of the need to enhance pupils' English proficiency and help them "survive" in the competitive international society.

Studying learners' attitudes towards school English class is believed to be an effective way to understand learners' beliefs, feelings, and behaviours regarding school English class. Although the relationship between attitudes and behaviour is rather complex, a person's attitude toward a particular object may most certainly influence his or her behaviour toward the object.

Since the reform, little has been explored with regard to how an "earlier start" has influenced the elementary school students. The attitudes they have towards learning English in the context of Taiwan remain unclear.

The implementation of a reform concerning language can be regarded as successful when there is effective learning and teaching in the language classroom. To facilitate effective learning and teaching in the English classroom, it is beneficial to understand students' attitudes towards learning English as well as how they like the ways they learn English.

- **(B)** The results of this study show that such educational goals have been achieved, confirming the effectiveness of the blog-based blended model for the English for Hospitality and Tourism course. The findings of the study are discussed and presented as follows: (1) the blended model combining blog and face-to-face instruction can be an effective teaching and learning approach for L2 learners and instructors of Hospitality and Tourism related courses; (2) students' professional skills were improved through this blended approach, such as enunciation, facial expressions, posture, gestures, multimedia software usage, and filming applications; (3) students could benefit from the processes of autonomous learning, collaborative learning, reviews of their peers' and their own films, and the instructor's feedback through blogging (Chen et al, 2011; Liu & Chang, 2010; Liu & Lin, 2007; Liu, Shih & Tsai, 2011; Lou, Wu & Shih, 2010; Shih, 2010) and (4) students are more willing to share their thoughts, ideas, and comments with peers on the blog for avoiding losing face in front of others and thus to ease their stage fright. Furthermore, the factors of the learning satisfaction survey questionnaire were confirmed, containing Factor I: Blended learning effectiveness; Factor II: Learning attitude towards the blog platform; Factor III: Operation of the blog platform; and Factor IV: The Design of the blog platform and the short film. Finally, using blended teaching approach into an ESP could be very time-consuming and it requires some extra efforts from both the instructor and students but its outcome can be very rewarding. - (C) After more than a decade of research, scientists at the University of Oxford, England, have identified the gene which they believe is involved in the development of language. And they believe this discovery may help explain **one of the most distinctive human attributes**. The research team, led by Dr. Anthony P. Monaco, published its findings in the journal *Nature*.

Dr. Monaco says that their finding is the first gene identified for a speech and language disorder, and the importance of their finding is that it "can take us forward into understanding the developmental pathways underlying speech and language."

The gene came to light through studies of a large family of several generations in East London in

which 14 out of the 29 family members suffer the same speech and language disorder. It is this half – all descendants of the same grandmother – that shares the mutated version of this gene. They have difficulty controlling the movements of their tongue, lips, and mouth and, as a result, have problems in communication. They also make frequent grammatical errors, indicating they have difficulty understanding grammatical rules. However, intelligence tests show that relatives with the defect have normal or above average intelligence, so the mutated gene seems **the culprit**.

According to Dr. Monaco, the gene's normal function is like a "master switch" which turns on other genes during the development of language. He believes that this gene and the genes with which it interacts may be part of a genetic network for language. "We think it's important in brain development, of certain areas of the brain, which are probably involved in the circuitry in the development of language," Mr. Monaco said.

Nonetheless, Mr. Monaco and other experts alike are reluctant to claim that these genes are solely associated with speech and language. Dr. Bruce Tomblin, a speech pathologist in University of Iowa, speculates that the gene and the ones it interacts with may have other functions as well; thus, assuming these genes control a special speech and language circuit would be risky. "It remains unclear whether we would want to say that this is a speech and language gene in that it does appear as though these people had often time probably other problems that may not be solely limited to language," said Dr. Tomblin.

Dr. Elizabeth Bates, the director of the Center of Language Research at the University of California at San Diego, agrees with this view. She mentions that it has been shown in other studies that the family with the language disorder has problems with musical pitch and rhythm and with hand movements, which suggests the gene is connected to more than just linguistic functions.

The Oxford team is also studying the molecular structure of the gene and comparing it with its analog in chimpanzees and other primates to see how far it has evolved. "Most genes will have changes over millions of years between the species," said Dr. Monaco. "Since language and speech is a characteristic human behavior, we would want to see if this gene evolved faster in humans than animals."
